You are directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Acton residing in the Water Supply District as bounded and defined by Chapter 326 of the Acts of 1912, Section 1 and 13 of said Act, and new extensions accepted by the District qualified to vote in election and town affairs to assemble in:

Town Hall, Acton Center Monday, February 20, 1956 at Eight O'clock P. M.

Then and there to act on the following articles:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To elect by ballot a Clerk for one year, a Treasurer for one year, and one member of the Board of Water Commissioners to serve for the term of three years, and to fix salaries of same.

Article 3. To hear and act on the report of the Water Commissioners, the Treasurer, the Collector and other officers of the District or any committee appointed at any previous meetings.

Article 4. To see if the District will authorize the Treasurer to borrow money, with the approval of the Water Commissioners, if necessary, in anticipation of revenue of the current year.

Article 5. To see if the Water District will vote to instruct the Water Commissioners to have an annual audit of the various accounts of the Water District or act anything thereon.

Article 6. To see what sums of money the Water District will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the usual expenses of the District.

Article 7. To see if the District will vote to rescind the vote under Articles 8 and 9 of February 21, 1955 viz: "VOTED: That the District transfer the unexpended balance of \$8,624.04, from Article 13, voted at the annual meeting of February 15, 1954, to extend the water main, install hydrants, and necessary fittings from the end of the main in front of the house of Norman Perkins on Arlington Street to the new street, Agawam Road, West Acton, a distance of approximately twelve hundred (1200) feet," and transfer the balance to Unexpended Appropriation Balances account.

Article 8. To see if the District will vote to transfer from surplus revenue the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) to the Purchase of Land account established under Article 10 of February 21, 1955, or act anything thereon.

Article 9. To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) from surplus revenue, to install service connections in suitable locations for the purpose of supplying water for public skating rinks, with the approval of the Commissioners, or act anything thereon.

Article 10. To see if the District will vote to transfer the balance from Unexpended Appropriation Balances account to defray the cost of water main extension on Wood Lane, voted under Article 3 of September 19, 1955, or act anything thereon.

Hereof fail not and make due returns of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Water Commissioners on or before the time of holding said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the Board of Water Commissioners:

I wish to make the following report covering the activities of the District for the year 1955:

The new gravel packed well off Main Street has been completed and 1200 feet of 8-inch water main laid connecting the new well.

A contract for pumping equipment for the new station has been awarded. The station is expected to be in operation by early spring.

The extension on Robbins Street has been completed and consists of 1400 feet of 8-inch pipe and two hydrants.

Due to the drought in July, it was necessary, for the first time in the history of the District, to curtail the use of water by banning lawn sprinkling.

During the August flood a portable chlorinator was used for three days as a safety measure.

Extensions have been made on private streets by Albert Jenks on Oneida, Mohegan, Quabog, and Agawam Roads. Extensions on Mohawk, Seneca, Seminole, and Mohegan Roads have been accepted by the District. Also extensions on Tuttle Drive, off Prospect Street, have been made by the Revolutionary Ridge Company.

One hundred new services have been installed during the year. Repairs were made on 72 old services.

Total water pumped from October 1, 1954, to October 1, 1955: 109,049,982 gallons.

Increase over 1954 — 9,616,008 gallons.

I recommend to the Commissioners that steps should be taken to eliminate dead ends in the distribution system, either by loops or cross connections, wherever possible.

The stand pipe should be drained, inspected, cleaned, and painted inside and out. This would prolong the life of the tank.

Abstract of the proceedings of the Annual Water Meeting of the West and South Water Supply District of Acton held in Town Hall, Acton Center.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 1955, at Eight o'clock P. M.

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Chose David R. Kinsley, Moderator of the meeting.

Article 2. To elect by ballot a Clerk for one year, a Treasurer for one year, one member of the Board of Water Commissioners to serve for the term of three years, and one member of the Board of Water Commissioners to serve for the term of one year, to fill a vacancy, and to fix salaries of same.

Elected: Mrs. Beryl B. Silva, Clerk for one year. Elected: Ormal S. Laffin, Treasurer for one year.

Elected: Otto O. Pasanen, Water Commissioner for three

years.

Elected: Donald L. Loring, Water Commissioner for one year.

Voted: To fix salaries the same as last year.

Article 3. To hear and act on the report of the Water Commissioners, the Treasurer, the Collector and other officers of the District or any committee appointed at any previous meetings.

Voted: To accept the reports of the District officers and committees.

Article 4. To see if the District will authorize the Treasurer to borrow money, with the approval of the Water Commissioners, if necessary, in anticipation of revenue of the current year.

Voted: That the District Treasurer with the approval of the Water Commissioners, be and hereby is authorized to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the financial year beginning January 1, 1955, and to issue a note or notes therefor payable within one year, any debt or debts incurred under this vote to be paid from the revenue of said financial year.

Article 5. To see if the Water District will vote to instruct the Water Commissioners to have an annual audit of the various accounts of the Water District or act anything thereon.

Voted: To instruct the Board of Water Commissioners to have an annual audit of the various accounts of the Water District under the direction of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Article 6. To see if the District will vote to have a committee of three appointed by the moderator to make a study of procedures for acceptance and financing of future extensions.

Voted: That the moderator appoint a committee of three to make a study of procedures for acceptance and financing of future extensions.

Article 7. To see what sums of money the Water District will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the usual expenses of the District.

Voted: To appropriate the receipts of the District for the maintenance and operation of the District, and specific appropriations as follows:

the Treasurer with the approval of the Commissioners, to borrow such sums as may be necessary to meet said appropriation or act anything thereon.

Voted: To act on Articles 8 and 9 together. (Unanimous vote).

Article 9. To see if the District will vote to appropriate the unexpended balance from Article 13, voted at the annual meeting of February 15, 1954, to defray the cost of the extension voted under Article 8 of this warrant.

Voted: That the District transfer the unexpended balance of \$8,624.04, from Article 13, voted at the annual meeting of February 15, 1954, to extend the water main, install hydrants, and necessary fittings from the end of the main in front of the house of Norman Perkins on Arlington Street to the new street, Agawam Road, West Acton, a distance of approximately twelve hundred (1200) feet. (Unanimous vote).

Article 10. To see if the District will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of acquiring by purchase or by eminent domain or by both methods, all or any of the following described parcels of land for public use as an additional water supply, including in such use the erection of buildings as shall be voted by the District, and shown on a plan of land in Acton surveyed for the West and South Water Supply District of Acton by Horace F. Tuttle, dated January 3, 1955, to wit:

Parcel 2 containing 4.90 acres, belonging to Augustine B. Conant and Brewster Conant is bounded Northwesterly by Main Street 675.70 feet; Northeasterly by land of Waldo P. Lapham (parcel 4) and estate of Daniel S. Davis (parcel 5) 416 feet; Southeasterly by (parcel 3) land of Robert E. and Doris J. Woodbine 691 feet; and Southwesterly by land of Augustine B. Conant and Brewster Conant 309 feet.

Emerson, and authorize the Treasurer with the approval of the Commissioners to borrow such sums as may be necessary to perform such work, or act anything thereon.

Voted: To act on Articles 11 and 12 together. (Unanimous vote).

Article 12. To see if the District will vote to appropriate the unexpended balance from Article 7, voted at the annual meeting of February 15, 1954, to defray the cost of work under Article 11 of this warrant, or act anything thereon.

Sir:

As directed by you, I have made an audit of the books and accounts of the West and South Water Supply District of Acton for the year ending December 31, 1955, and submit the following report thereon:

The financial transactions of the district, as recorded on the books of the departments receiving or disbursing district funds, were examined and checked.

The books and accounts of the district accountant were examined and checked. The ledger accounts were analyzed for the year 1955, the recorded receipts being compared with the treasurer's records and the recorded payments being checked with the orders approved by the commissioners and with the treasurer's books. The appropriations and transfers, as recorded, were checked with the amounts voted by the district as shown on the district clerk's record of district meetings. A trial balance was taken off, and, after the necessary adjustments were made, a balance sheet, which is appended to this report, was prepared showing the financial condition of the district on December 31, 1955.

It was again noted that an appropriation from surplus revenue was made by the board of water commissioners at a monthly meeting, and it is again recommended that all such appropriations be acted on and voted at the district meetings.

The books and accounts of the district treasurer were examined and checked. The receipts, as recorded, were analyzed and checked, while the payments were compared with the approved orders on file. The cash book additions were proved, and the cash balance on December 31, 1955 was verified by reconciliation of the bank balance with a statement furnished by the bank of deposit and by inspection of the savings bank book showing the deposit of district funds.

The deductions from employees' salaries for Federal taxes and the county retirement system were listed and reconciled with the amounts due and paid to the Federal government and the county treasurer.

The payments on account of maturing debt and interest were compared with the amounts falling due and with the cancelled securities and coupons on file.

The charges for water rates and services outstanding according to the previous audit, as well as all subsequent charges, were audited and proved. The payments to the treasurer were compared with the treasurer's record of receipts, the abatements were checked with the commissioners' records of abatements granted, and the outstanding accounts were listed and proved.

In order to verify the correctness of the outstanding accounts, notices were mailed to a number of persons whose names appeared on the books as owing money to the district, and from the replies received it appears that the accounts, as listed, are correct.

It was found necessary to make a detailed check of the postings to the water accounts, which added to the length of time consumed in making the audit

The surety bonds of the district officials were examined and found to be in proper form.

In addition to the balance sheet, there are appended to this report tables showing a reconciliation of the treasurer's cash, as well as summaries of the payroll deductions and water accounts.

For the cooperation extended by all the district officials during the progress of the audit, I wish, on behalf of my assistants and for myself, to express appreciation.
