A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Proposal for Amendment to the Groundwater Protection District By-Law.

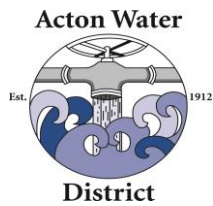
Mr. Parenti stated that since Concord's purchase of the 55 Knox Trail parcel is seemingly not going to happen that there is a diminished need to present the amendment to the Groundwater Protection District (GWPD) bylaw at the April 1st planning board meeting, and subsequent Town Meeting on April 8th. A discussion of land at 37 Knox Trail that the Town of Concord is now looking to purchase ensued. Mr. Parenti asked the group if Concord plans to park many buses on this property. Mr. Mostoller mentioned that he and Counselor Bassett looked at the land area and it's only a $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre, seemingly not large enough to park buses. Mr. Rosen stated that he is not sure what Concord will do with their buses, they need to go somewhere, but this lot is very small, and available space is minimal given there is an existing office building on the premises.

Janet Adachi, Chair of the Town of Acton Board of Selectmen stated that she had a conversation with Carmen Reis of Concord about the 55 Knox Trail purchase and it sounds like that deal is dead. The Town of Concord plans to have a special town meeting with a new article to purchase 37 Knox Trail and another article to rescind the 55 Knox Trail purchase.

Mr. Malchodi stated that his comments for the changes in the Groundwater Protection District By-Law are no longer valid.

Mr. Stuntz stated that the Commissioners can now move forward with recommendations for changes in the Town's Groundwater Protection District By-Law in the fall and ensure that any amendment meshes with the

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Town's Hazardous Waste By-Law. So for now the Commissioners agree to table the article until a potential Special Town Meeting in the fall.

Mr. Phillips, Counselor Bassett, Mr. Mostoller and a few interested citizens of Acton had a general discussion of the 37 Knox Trail property so that Mr. Phillips could get a better handle of where this property is around the Assabet Wells' Zone II and Zone III land.

Mr. Stuntz made a motion to withdraw the proposed amendment to the Town of Acton's Groundwater Protection District By-Law from consideration at the Town's April Annual Meeting until the fall special town meeting. Mr. Parenti seconded the motion and all were in favor.

B. NEW BUSINESS:
