WATER COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

To the Citizens of the Water District of Acton:

We present the annual report of our doings for the year ending March 15th, 1927.

As the past year is the first year that the District has not made a tax levy we feel that the showing is very gratifying. The treasurer's report shows that the receipts nearly equalled the expenses. We fear that the coming year will show a deficit if a tax is not levied as our estimate of receipts is eight hundred and eighty dollars less than the past year's receipts.

The income will take care of the bond and interest payments, also the maintenance account, but will not take care of the construction account especially if there are many new services and hydrants to install.

The matter of a tax levy must be decided at the annual meeting, April 5th.
