To the Clerk of the West and South Water Supply District of Acton, GREETINGS:

You are directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Acton residing in the Water Supply District, as bounded and defined by Chapter 326 of the Acts of 1912, Sections 1 and 13 of said Act, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to assemble in FIREMAN'S HALL, WEST ACTON,

TUESDAY, APRIL 6, 1937, at Eight o'clock p. m. Then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting. Article 2. To elect by ballot a Clerk for one year, a Treasurer for one year and Auditor for one year, and one Member of the Board of Water Commissioners to serve for the term of three years, and to fix salaries of same.

Article 3. To hear and act on the reports of the Water Commissioners, Treasurer, Collector and other officers of the District, or any Committee appointed at any previous meeting.

Article 4. To see if the District will authorize the Treasurer to borrow money with the approval of the Water Commissioners if necessary, in anticipation of revenue the current year.

Article 5. To see if the District will vote to discontinue the agreement whereby the takers of water on the Liberty Street extension are required to guarantee six percent revenue from the line, or act anything thereon.

Article 6. To see if the district will vote to reduce the guaranteed annual revenue from new extensions from ten percent of the cost of the extension as now required, to a guaranteed annual revenue amounting to six percent of the total cost of the extension, said guarantee to remain in effect for a ten-year period from the date of completing the extension.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting copies attested by you, thereof seven days at least before the time of said meeting as directed by vote of the Water District.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Water Commissioners on or before the time of holding said meeting.

WATER COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

To the Citizens of the West and South Water Supply District of Acton:

We present herewith our report for the year ending March 15, 1937.

At the beginning of this year the Commissioners increased the amount of water furnished at the minimum rate of \$12.00, from 25,000 to 30,000 gallons; thereby effecting a considerable saving to many users of water.

Although this resulted in a loss in revenue from some services, it was partly offset by the addition of thirteen new services.

An extension amounting to 1300 feet of six-inch pipe was laid on Kingsley road. This included two hydrants to furnish fire protection for seven houses. Five services have been tapped into this line. The cost of the pipe and materials were paid by the District and the property owners furnished the labor for trenching and back-filling.

At Piper's corner the hydrant location was changed and a new hydrant and valve installed. On account of road changes at Lizotte's corner, a hydrant was re-located and a valve installed.

The W. P. A. project made necessary the raising and relocating of a hydrant at the High School.

All hydrants have been re-painted.

The standpipe was re-painted at a total cost of \$754. It was found necesary to sandblast the three bottom sections, which of course added considerably to the cost of the job. Also the inside of the roof was painted for the first time.

The commissioners have before them a request for an extension on Martin street, South Acton. The estimated cost of this extension is \$2,000, and at present there are only three possible takers of water on the proposed line.

We shall defer any action on this extension until we have the action of voters on Article 6 of the warrant.
