Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To elect by ballot a Clerk for one year, a Treasurer for one year, and Auditor for one year and one Member of the Board of Water Commissioners to serve for the term of three years and fix salaries of same.

Article 3. To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to employ for additional compensation any of their members and to fix the additional compensation of such members, as provided in Section 4A Chapter 41 of the General Laws.

Article 4. To hear and act on the report of the Water Commissioners, Treasurer, Collector and other officers of the District or any committee appointed at any previous meeting.

Article 5. To see if the District will authorize the Treasurer to borrow money with the approval of the Water Commissioners if necessary, in anticipation of revenue of current year.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting copies attested by you, in three or more public places in the District thereof seven days at least before the time of said meeting as directed by vote of the Water District.

Hereof fail not and make due returns of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Water Commissioners on or before the time of holding said meeting.

WATER COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

We present herewith our report for the year ending March 15, 1939.

In accordance with the vote of the last annual meeting, the accounts of the District have been audited by the State Department of Accounts and we call your attention to the accompanying report of this audit.

During the year three new services have been added and

one broken hydrant replaced.

At a special meeting the District voted to accept a P. W. A. grant on a \$50,000 project covering extension of pipe lines and a new engine.

Notes have been issued by the District to the amount of \$30,000 to cover its share of the project at an interest rate of 134%. This loan is to be amortized at the rate of \$2,000 a year over a 15 year period.

This fund together with federal funds which have been received is deposited in a special construction account in accord-

ance with Federal regulations.

The P. W. A. contract has been awarded to the R. H. Newell Company and calls for a new Diesel engine and the laying of approximately 3½ miles of "Transito" pipe, most of which is six inch.

On account of bad weather only a small amount of pipe has been laid to date, but the new engine, a Fairbanks Morse

Diesel, has been installed and is operating.

Up to the present time, fourteen property owners have indicated that they will take water as soon as the new lines are completed. With the addition of the new engine, the mechanical equipment of the District is in good condition and should require little expense, other than general upkeep, for some time.

Article 3. To hear and act on the reports of the Water Commissioners, Treasurer, Collector and other officers of the District, or any committee appointed at any previous meeting.

Voted: To accept the reports of the District Officers.

Article 4. To see if the District will authorize the Treasurer to borrow money with the approval of the Water Commissioners if necessary, in anticipation of revenue the current year.

Voted: That the District treasurer with the approval of the Water Commissioners be and is hereby authorized to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning april 1, 1938 and to issue a note or notes therefore payable within one year, any debt or debts incurred under this vote to be paid from the revenue of said financial year.

Article 5. To see if Water District will vote to petition the Director of Accounts for an audit of the accounts of the District.

Voted: To have the Water District petition the Director of Accounts for an audit of the accounts of the district.

Article 6. To see if the District will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 40, Section 42A to F, inclusive of the Gen-

eral Laws, whereby unpaid Water Charges become a lien on the property served and to instruct the Clerk to file a certificate of such acceptance in the Registry of Deeds, or act anything thereon.

Voted: That the District accept the provisions of Chapter 40, Section 42A to F., inclusive of the General Laws, whereby unpaid Water Charges become a lien on the property served and to instruct the Clerk to file a certificate of such acceptance in the Registry of Deeds.

WATER MEETING

Abstract of the proceedings of the Special Meeting of the West and South Water Supply District of Acton held at the West Acton Woman's Clubhouse

AUGUST 31, 1938, 8 P. M.

Chose David R. Kinsley, Moderator of the meeting. The Moderator appointed Lossie E. Laird, Benjamin Ineson, Porter Jenks and Charles S. Coulter to act as Tellers, to receive and count the ballots.

Article 1. To see if the West and South Water Supply District of Acton will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of extending water mains throughout said District and authorize and direct the Board of Water Commissioners to accept on behalf of the District, for use in carrying out such project, a Federal grant of money pursuant to the Public Works Administration Appropriation Act of 1938; and authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to construct said project and contract with respect thereto; and authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Water Commissioners, to borrow such sums as may be necessary to meet any appropriation made and to use any other available funds that may be raised by taxation or appropriated for that purpose, or take any action relative thereto.

The following motion was made by Albert R. Jenks:

For the purpose of extending water mains of not less than six inches in diameter, but less than sixteen inches in diameter, and to enable the District to secure the benefits of funds granted by the Federal Government under the Public Works Administration Appropriation Act of 1938, there be raised and appropriated the sum of \$50,000.00 (fifty thousand dollars) and the Treasurer, with the approval of the Water Commissioners, be and hereby is authorized to borrow the sum of \$30,000.00 and to issue bonds or notes of the District therefor, under authority of and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 50 of the Acts of 1938, said bonds or notes to be payable in not more than 15 years at such term and maximum rate of interest as may be fixed by the Emergency Finance Board.

All moneys received by way of grant from the Federal Government on account of this project shall be applied first to meet the cost of construction thereof and any balance shall be applied to the payment of the lien herein authorized.

The Water Commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to accept on behalf of the District, for use in carrying out such project, a Federal grant of money, pursuant to the Public Works Administration Appropriation Act of 1938; and the Water Commissioners are authorized to proceed with the construction of said project and to enter into all necessary and proper contracts and agreements in respect thereto, all subject to applicable Federal regulations; and the Water Commissioners are authorized to do all other acts and things necessary or convenient for obtaining said grant, making said loan, and constructing said project.

After a discussion of the motion, it was voted to proceed to vote on the motion by ballot, those in favor of the motion voting YES and those opposed voting NO.

Article 2. To see if the Water District will vote to rescind the vote of the Annual Meeting April 6, 1937 "That all New Extensions be made on a guaranteed annual revenue amounting to six per cent of the total cost of the extension to remain in effect for a ten year period from the date of the completing of the extension," or take any action relative thereto.

Voted: To rescind the six per cent guarantee on ex-

tensions.

Sir:

As directed by you, I have made an audit of the books and accounts of the West and South Water Supply District of Acton for the period from .pril 1, 1935, to May 24, 1938, and submit

the following report thereon:

The financial transactions of the district as recorded on the books of the Treasurer were examined. The recorded receipts were analyzed and the payments were checked with the Commissioners' orders and with the approved vouchers on file. The cash balance as of May 24, 1938, was verified by a reconciliation of the bank balance with a statement furnished by the bank in which district funds were deposited and by examination of the savings bank books.

The payments on account of debt and interest were verified by a comparison with the amounts falling due, the cancelled securities and coupons being checked and the outstanding debt

being listed and proved.

The commitments of water charges were examined and verified. The payments to the Treasurer were compared with the Treasurer's record of receipts and the outstanding accounts were listed and proved.

The outstanding accounts were further verified by mailing notices to all persons whose names appeared on the books as owing money to the district and from the replies received it appears that the outstanding accounts, as listed, are correct.

A balance sheet showing the financial condition of the district was prepared as of May 24, 1938. This balance sheet indicates that the district is in excellent financial condition.

There are appended to this report, in addition to the balance sheet, tables showing a reconciliation of the Treasurer's and the Collector's cash, as well as a summary of the water accounts receivable.

For the cooperation extended by the officials of the district during the process of the audit, I wish, on behalf of my assistants and for myself, to express appreciation.
